# Message from the Board President

Four years into the biggest fiscal crisis since the Great Depression, fiscal year 2011-2012 saw alternative media struggling to meet the challenge of trying to stay financially sound while keeping the voice of the unrepresented 99% alive and independent. As the FCC considers further relaxing the rules governing media consolidation, networks like Pacifica and its affiliates (including KFCF) are on the front line of the battle to maintain access to information necessary to a healthy democracy and unfettered by the ever-encroaching corporate agenda.

It can be done! Despite the billions of dollars that poured into the coffers of the Super Pacs unleashed by the Citizens United decision, this most recent election showed that money is not the only deciding factor in who runs our country. And on the local front, KFCF and the Fresno Free College Foundation have worked hard to expand the coverage of the important struggles going on in the Central Valley.

This past year our News Stringers were able to bring the story of the fight over Jesse Morrow Mountain, the Darling rendering plant in West Fresno, the progress of the San Joaquin water restoration, and the ongoing struggle of Fresno's homeless to maintain dignity in the face of continued sweeps and demolition of encampments, to the KPFA evening news heard in the Bay Area and Los Angeles.

Our local shows, including Stir It Up and Street Heat, Valley Black Talk, Keeping it Real with Dr. Jean Kennedy, Speaking Truth to Empire, Sierra Nevada Earth First, Down on the Farm, Down in the Valley, Clearing the Air, Movement of the Americas, and Nuestro Foro, have kept our community informed of important issues being addressed in the Central Valley that would otherwise go unreported.

The Foundation has also brought important voices to Fresno, including Walter Turner who spoke at our 2011 Annual Banquet about what's happening in Africa and the African Diaspora (information not available through the mainstream media), and Juan Gonzalez and Joe Torres who were here talking about their new book, "News for All the People: The Epic Story of Race and the American Media."

We've also brought cultural and artistic work to the front, including a dramatic reading of "Howl" and a performance by David Gans of "Dead to the World." And if you haven't heard the new music and art programming we've added to our line-up, "Undercurrents" with Gregg McVicar (on Saturdays from 4-6), or "LA Theatre Works" (airing Sundays at 7 p.m.) you're missing a real treat.

This is all possible because of the financial support of listener-sponsors like you! When the power pack for our transmitter failed earlier this year you came through with the funds needed to replace it and get our signal up to full strength. As we head into 2013, the Board has been talking about studio expansion and upgrade so that we can improve the quality and scope of our local programming. We'll be talking with you more about this in the coming months. We wish all of you a great new year and hope that we can count on your continued support and participation. - Sue Kern

# **Message from the Executive Director**

Dear Friends,

It has been a fairly good year for KFCF. We had a few disasters, like our transmitter power supply going away this summer and it looking like it might be impossible to find an off the shelf replacement, and a custom built one being as expensive as a new transmitter. Luckily we were able to get support from our subscribers, and found out the person we needed to talk to at the transmitter company was on vacation and that a replacement power supply was soon available for only a few thousand dollars. We have been working on building up redundancy on our on-air equipment and have a number of pieces of backup equipment now.

Our income dropped somewhat this year, and we've been trying to adjust our budget, but with many costs being fixed it has been difficult. We've put in a new phone system and this has stabilized our phone costs (which were going up 25% every 6 months.) PG&E has just put us on a new mandated time of use schedule that doubles our power costs during part of the year. We are looking for ideas to raise additional funds and things we can do to help contain those costs.

We had a number of great speakers and concerts in the last year, and we've added some new programming like KPFA's UpFront and Father Figures, The Bioneers, LA Theatre Works, plus locally produced shows Nuestra Casa (in conjunction with Arte Americas), Movement of The Americas and Keeping it Real.

Thanks for your generous financial support, and words of encouragement.




